Funding for Primary School PE and Sports

The government is providing an extra £150 million of annual funding for the academic years of 2013 to 2014 and 2014 to 2015. The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) and Sports programs offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governments departments including Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport. The funding allocated to schools will be 'ring fenced' – this means it can only be spent specifically on PE and sport in schools.

We are using our Sport Premium to improve the quality of PE and sport provision in the following ways:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with our teachers when teaching PE
- Providing release cover staff to release teachers for professional development in PE and sport
- Running sports competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games
- Purchasing more sports equipment for use during playtimes and after school activities
- Purchasing equipment for Hockey and Netball as the two games we have adopted as the games we will focus on in 2014-15
- Developing the Back Play Pitch with the School Council to enable more sporting activities during the play breaks
- Subsidising a variety of after school sports clubs that focus on sport to encourage all pupils to participate in some physical activity

How will we be spending the money?

Hiring qualified sports coaches to work alongside teachers when teaching PE

We have developed a link with Southfields Academy and Moving Matters (Lambeth) whose role is to work alongside class teachers providing training to staff and ensuring the children receive a high quality PE and Sport provision.

Chris works alongside Mrs Bennett on Thursday afternoon focusing on Gymnastics and Games.

Rob works alongside Mr Borough and Ms Ramkeeson also focusing on Gymnastics and Games skills.

Year 2 – Developing 'games skills'



We are using the fund to subsidise After School Provision giving access to sporting activities that would appeal to all pupils: for the EYRs and girls in particular.



Mr Burrough, our PE subject leader, has established a link with Swaffield Primary School to develop inter-school netball matches. We are establishing inter-school training sessions and matches.

The junior pupils enjoy playing hockey during the lunchtime break, so we are investing in new equipment for them.

We have adopted both Netball and Hockey as the games we will be training the children and staff in for this next year.
